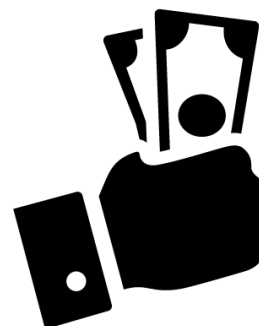

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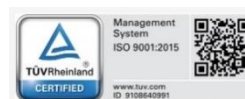
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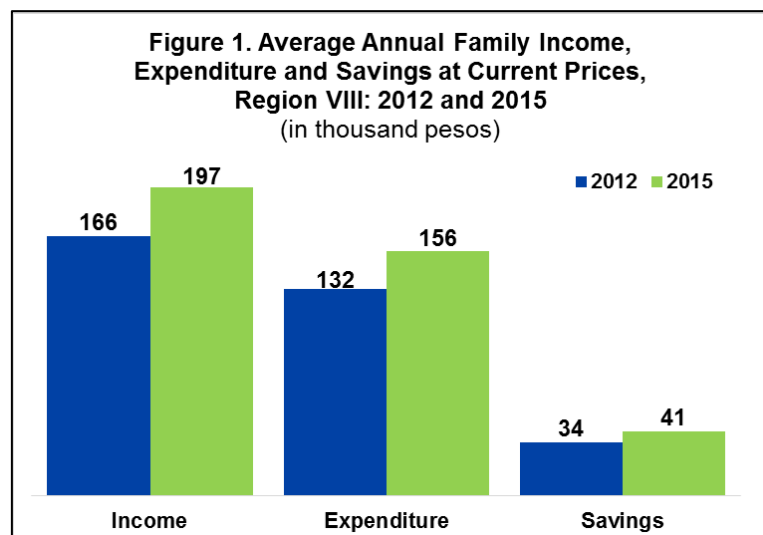
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EV's Average Annual Family Income in 2015 is estimated at Php 197 thousand

The average annual family income of families in Eastern Visayas was estimated at Php 197 thousand in 2015. This figure was higher by 19 percent from the Php 166 thousand recorded in 2012. However, adjusting for the inflation between 2012 and 2015 using the 2006 prices, the average annual family income in 2015 was valued at Php 129 thousand recording a minimal increase of 4 percent from the Php 124 thousand in 2012.

In 2015, the proportion of families whose income were derived mainly from Wage/Salaries, which includes all forms of compensation whether in cash or in kind was recorded at 41.9 percent. About 34.7 percent of families derived their income mainly from Other Sources of Income, which include imputed rental values of owner-occupied dwelling units, interests, rentals including landowner's share of agricultural products, pensions, support and the value of food and non-food items received as gifts by the family. Meanwhile, about 23.3 percent of the families received their income from Entrepreneurial Activities or net receipts derived from the operation of family-operated enterprises, activities and the practice of profession or trade.

The median income among families in the region was estimated at Php 124 thousand in 2015. This implies that half of the families in Eastern Visayas have annual income below Php 124 thousand.

The average annual family expenditure of families in Eastern Visayas totaled to Php 156 thousand in 2015. This figure is higher by 18 percent from the Php 132 thousand recorded in 2012. However, adjusting for the inflation between 2012 and 2015 using the 2006 prices, the average annual family expenditure in 2015 was valued at Php 103 thousand, recording a minimal increase of 4 percent from the Php 99 thousand in 2012.

The share of family expenditure among families in the region in 2015 was highest on food at 44.9 percent. Second highest share of family expenditure was House Rent/Rental Value recorded 9.4 percent, followed by Water, Electricity and Other Fuels at 8.0 percent.

On the other hand, families had the least share of expenditure on Furnishings, and Routine Household Maintenance at 2.4 percent, closely followed by Clothing and Footwear at 2.5 percent.

The median expenditure among families in the region was estimated at Php 108 thousand in 2015. This implies that half of the families in Eastern Visayas have annual expenditure below P108 thousand.

The estimated average annual family income and expenditure in the region translated to an average annual family savings of Php 41 thousand in 2015. This figure is significantly higher by 21 percent from the Php 34 thousand recorded in 2012. However, adjusting for the inflation between 2012 and 2015 using the 2006 prices, the average annual family savings in 2015 was valued at Php 27 thousand, recording no significant difference from the Php 25 thousand in 2012.

The Gini Coefficient in the region went down to 0.4649 in 2015 from 0.4834 in 2012 signifying a slight improvement in terms of equality of income of families across region. The gini coefficient measures the income inequality within a population which ranges from 0 to 1, with 0 indicating perfect income equality among families and 1 indicating absolute income inequality.
