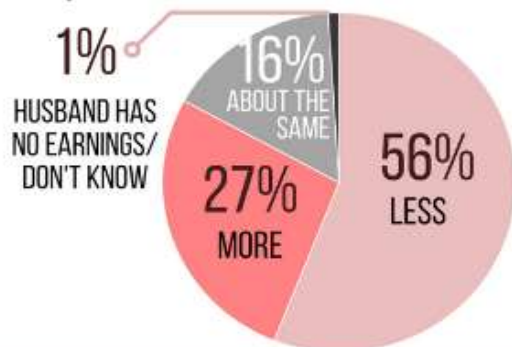

The **2017 Philippines National Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS 2017)** is the sixth Demographic and Health Survey (DHS) conducted in the Philippines as part of The DHS Program and the 11th national demographic survey conducted since 1968. The survey is designed to provide indicators on fertility, fertility preferences, family planning practice, childhood mortality, maternal and child health, knowledge and attitude regarding HIV/AIDS, and violence against women.

The NDHS 2017 was implemented by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA). Funding for the survey was provided by the Government of the Philippines. The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) provided technical assistance and equipment through ICF under The DHS Program, which assists countries in the collection of data to monitor and evaluate population, health, and nutrition programs. Since 1993, an NDHS has been implemented in the country approximately every five years under the DHS program.

EASTERN VISAYAS

END violence against WOMEN Eastern Visayas

Spousal violence collected in the National Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS) are of women who have experienced any of the specified acts of physical, sexual, or emotional violence committed by their current husband/partner (if currently married) or most recent husband/partner (if formerly married), ever and in the 12 months preceding the survey

PREVALENCE OF SPOUSAL VIOLENCE

40 out of **100**

ever-married women age 15-49 have experienced any form of physical, sexual, or emotional violence by their current or most recent husband/partner. Women are more likely to have experienced emotional violence (35%) than physical violence (18%) or sexual violence (7%).

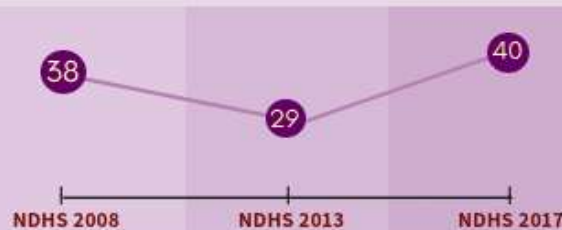

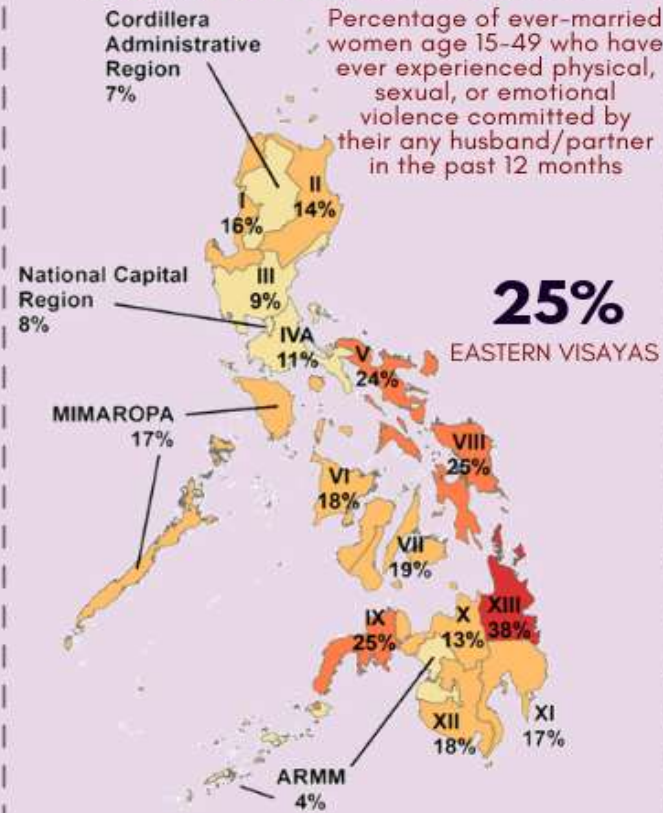

MARITAL CONTROL BY HUSBAND

16% of ever-married women age 15-49 reported that their current or most recent husband/partner had ever exhibited three or more specific types of the following controlling behaviors:

- jealous or angry if she talks to other men
- frequently accuses her of being unfaithful
- does not permit her to meet her female friends
- tries to limit her contact with her family
- insists on knowing where she is at all times
